

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

❖ MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS



Care and maintenance of synthetic leather is crucial for extending the product's lifespan and preserving its functionality. Regular cleaning is important for removing surface dust and residual. Use a soft-bristled brush or a clean cloth to gently remove loose dirt or dust.



Avoid placing any objects with excessive heat on the products and refrain from direct contact with an iron. Ensure that the products are kept away from devices such as electric heaters, infrared heaters, or solid fuel stoves that emit direct heat.



Do not expose the products directly to sunlight. Exposure to direct sunlight can cause color fading and deformation in the product.



The products should be used with protecting them from chemicals such as hairspray, perfume, and cologne.



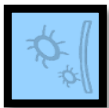
Do not use or keep commonly used household items such as nail polish containing solvents like acetone or alcohol, ink, etc., near the product to prevent splashing, contamination, and potential permanent damage.



Do not place newspapers or magazines on the product as the ink may transfer and leave permanent stains.



Handle the product with care to protect it from hard impacts, and prevent contact with sharp and pointed objects. When moving the product or changing its location within the house, avoid sliding it through tight spaces.



Store your product in a dry area at room temperature.



Regularly ventilate your clothing items to prevent the formation of unpleasant odors.

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The spilled liquid is absorbed from the fabric surface without pressing down using a highly absorbent material. On the second attempt, any remaining moisture is gently absorbed with a clean and dry material by lightly pressing down (such as cotton cloth, paper towel, etc.).



Stains that come into contact with heat, light, and air become permanent and difficult to remove. Therefore, clean the stain immediately without allowing it to dry. Otherwise, the stains become harder to clean and may leave permanent marks.



Prepare a solution consisting of mild soap and warm water for stains, and use a sponge or soft cloth to clean the affected area. Remember to rinse thoroughly the fabric with clean water to remove any soap residue. Avoid direct sunlight or heat sources and allow the fabric to air dry completely.



Never use detergent, abrasive cleaners, alcohol, bleach, or aggressive solvents for cleaning the product.



For stains such as gum that can become melted with heat, put some ice cubes in a bag and place the bag on the stain for a few minutes. Remove the bag and gently lift the hardened residue with cold.

Keep in Mind:

This maintenance and cleaning instruction aims to provide users with the correct ways to use all our products and ensure their longevity through proper care and cleaning methods. It is recommended to test the application methods on unseen areas of the product before use. Cleaning results may vary depending on the size of the stain, the cleaning product used, and the duration of exposure to the surface.

Some textile products (such as denim jeans, microfiber, and dark-colored fabrics) may transfer their colors to other items depending on the quality and type of pigments used or cleaning methods applied. This can occur under high humidity and temperature conditions and may be irreversible. Additionally, it is essential to ensure that the threads and textiles used in the final product alongside synthetic leather are dyed with non-migrating dyes. Otherwise, they may transfer color to the leather surface.
